

GENERAL ELECTION RESULTS

The Nov. 5 general election produced dramatic results for Building Trades union members and families. Most candidates endorsed by the Trades won their races, and important ballot measures for construction also won. On the national level, the Building Trades did not endorse Donald Trump, who won with 77,284,118 million votes against Trades endorsee Kamala Harris with 74,999,166.



STATE OF CALIFORNIA

UNITED STATES SENATOR

Adam Schiff, a Democrat endorsed by the Building Trades, won a full term with 58.9 percent of the votes, and he won the remainder of the late Sen. Dianne Feinstein's unexpired term with 58.8 percent.

PROP. 3: Constitutional amendment for marriage equality won with 63 percent.

PROP. 4: \$10 billion for drinking water improvements, climate, wildfire and forest programs; work will be done under prevailing wage/Project Labor Agreements; won with 60 percent.

Measure Y: The Building Trades opposed this measure, which mandates certain spending by the city and could possibly cut union jobs. It passed with 62 percent.

SAN FERNANDO COUNCIL

The two Building Trades-endorsed candidates did not win. The two seats available were won by the top vote-getters, Victoria Garcia with 29 percent and Patty Lopez with 23 percent. The Building Trades endorsees, Sean Rivas and Jason Strickler, came in third and fifth, respectively.

SANTA CLARITA COUNCIL

District 1: Patsy Ayala, endorsed by the Building Trades, won in a multi-candidate field with 36 percent of the votes.

SANTA MONICA COUNCIL

The two Building Trades-endorsed candidates both won: Dan Hall, who
